



### What's in the Box?




Unpack your Stratus 6 radio carefully and make sure that everything shown is present. If anything is missing or damaged, or if your the radio fails to operate, notify your dealer immediately. We recommend that you retain the original carton and packing materials in case you need to ship your radio in the future.

### **Home Dock Color-Coded Connections**

The color-coded Home Dock makes it simple to connect the cables to the appropriate connectors at the rear of the dock.




### **Remote Control Battery Replacement**

The Remote Control has a child safe battery compartment which requires a pointed object to open the battery compartment. A paper clip is recommended, as shown.

#### To Replace the Battery:

- 1. Press the paper clip or other object into the lock release opening on the Remote Control, and slide the battery compartment cover off of the Remote Control.
- **2.** Slide the battery out of the battery compartment.
- **3.** Replace with a new battery. Observe the correct orientation of the battery; the + positive side of the battery should be facing up.
- Replace the battery compartment cover.



There are two parts to setting up your Home Kit. First, connecting the Home Dock to your stereo or powered speakers, then placing and aiming the Home Antenna. Let's start with getting your Home Dock set up.


### **Step 1: Connect the Home Dock**

When installing the Home Dock in your home, choose a location in close proximity to your home stereo system or powered speakers, and also where the cable from the Indoor/Outdoor Antenna can reach the Home Dock. The location should be easily accessible and provide good visibility of the display, but should not be located where it will be in direct sunlight, which will affect the visibility of the display screen.

You will also need to decide whether you will be connecting your Home Dock to your home stereo system using the provided Stereo Audio Cable, or directly to powered speakers.


#### Connect the Indoor/Outdoor Antenna

Once you have selected a location, connect the antenna to the **ANT** connector at the rear of the Home Dock. (After completing a few additional steps, we will work on the location of the antenna.)



#### **Connect the Home Power Adapter**

Connect the Home Power Adapter to the **PWR** connector at the rear of the Home Dock, and plug it into a wall outlet.




# Connect the Home Dock to a Home Stereo System or Powered Speakers

The Home Dock can be connected to your home stereo system, or to a pair of powered speakers. If you are connecting to a home stereo system, see the following section. If you are connecting to a pair of powered speakers, see "To Connect the Home Dock to Your Powered Speakers" on page 14.

#### To Connect the Home Dock to Your Home Stereo System

The Home Dock can be connected to your home stereo system through the AUX IN or LINE IN connection of your home stereo system, using the provided Stereo Audio Cable.

- Take the provided Stereo Audio Cable and connect the single 3.5 mm (1/8") connector to the AUDIO connector at the rear of the Home Dock.
- 2. Connect the white left and red right Stereo Audio Cable connectors ("L" and "R" are also on each respective tip) to any available input other than PHONO on your home stereo system. (If your stereo's inputs are marked red and black, simply connect the white plug to the black input.)




**3.** Turn the home stereo system On, and make sure you select the correct input on your stereo system for the **AUX In** or **LINE In** connection.

#### To Connect the Home Dock to Your Powered Speakers

The Home Dock can be connected directly to a pair of powered speakers.


- **1.** Connect the 3.5 mm (1/8") connector from the powered speakers to the **AUDIO OUT** connector at the rear of the Home Dock.
- 2. Plug the powered speakers into an AC outlet.



**3.** Turn On the powered speakers.

#### **Dock Your Radio**

Place the radio into the Home Dock, aligning the connector on the Stratus 6 with the connector on the Home Dock, and gently press the Radio down until it is fully seated in the Home Dock. Press the power button on the radio to turn it on.




### Step 2: Install the Indoor/Outdoor Antenna

To begin, try experimenting with the Home Antenna to get a feel for the reception in your location. Move the antenna around the room or from room to room. Aim it from different windows. In major metropolitan areas, you might find that you get great reception in several locations without worrying too much about aim and placement.

Refer to your radio's User Guide for instructions, and access the **Signal** or


Signal Indicator screen of your radio to see a visual indication of signal strength. If you're receiving a good Satellite and Terrestrial signal strength, you're done. If not, try some of the suggestions which follow.



#### Other Indoor/Outdoor Antenna Installation Suggestions

If you find you are getting a signal, but it's inconsistent, try moving the Indoor/ Outdoor Antenna closer to a window, ideally one that is facing due south.

Not sure which way is south? Think about where the sun rises (in the east) and sets (in the west). Then stand so that east is to your left and you'll be facing south. Is there a window in the direction



you're facing? Move the antenna closer to the window.




**TIP!** Still not sure which way is south or where to place your Home Antenna? Look up your location on an online mapping Web site that offers satellite views of street addresses where you can easily see which way is south, and what window may offer an unobstructed view of the sky.

Another easy method is to start at any window, then work from window to window in a simple pattern to find the window gives the best signal strength. Note that the antenna must also have an unobstructed view. No trees or buildings blocking its aim. If the antenna is aimed through a window, be aware that blinds, screens, or any other non-glass elements such as thermal insulation can sometimes cause reception issues. If this is the case, you may want to use another window or place the

If you find a window that gives you good signal strength, you can place the antenna on the windowsill. The antenna may need to be placed on something to raise it above the level of the window frame.


antenna outside of the window.



If you don't have a window where you receive a consistent signal, or placing the antenna in a window is not a practical solution for you, **BETTER** reception can be achieved by placing the antenna outside on a window ledge, porch, table, or patio. The location you choose should provide the antenna with a clear view of the southern sky.

If none of the previous solutions work for you, then the **BEST** reception can be achieved by mounting the antenna outdoors, with a clear view of the southern sky.

Note that you will want to consider any potential hazards when you choose the mounting location, and possibly consider



professional installation. XM Radio Inc. is not liable for any damages.

To mount the antenna, you will need four screws (not included) with a 1/4" head (e.g., an M3 screw), and that are suitable for the material onto which you are affixing the antenna, (e.g., wood, metal, etc.). The screws should be spaced 30 mm (1-3/8") apart horizontally and 36.5 mm (1-1/8") vertically. Refer to the template on "Indoor/Outdoor Antenna Template" on page 56.

Once you have found a suitable location for the antenna, route the antenna cable to the Home Dock. Be sure you avoid any obstructions that could crimp, kink, or twist the cable. Use protective grommets wherever rough openings are encountered. If the antenna is installed outdoors, route

the cable from the antenna location to the interior of the home, working the cable through the basement, under a window sill, etc., and make adjustments to take up cable slack as necessary.




**TIP!** If your Indoor/Outdoor Antenna's cable isn't long enough, visit **siriusxm.ca**, or your favourite retailer, and consider a 15 m (50 ft.) Indoor/Outdoor Antenna Extension Cable or a Wireless Home Signal Repeater.

If the signal is good for either Satellite or Terrestrial (or both), and you are hearing the audio from the radio, the installation is complete.

If the signal reception is low, or intermittent, try another location for the antenna. Verify that the antenna is pointed south, and that the antenna's view of the sky is not blocked by a tree, a building, a bridge, or anything else. Adjust until you are receiving a good signal.

The Indoor/Outdoor Antenna's reception can also be tweaked by opening or closing the antenna clamshell, and turning the antenna. While observing the signal strength, make small adjustments to the angle of tilt of the clamshell until the highest possible signal strength is achieved. If you have not wall-mounted the antenna, turn the antenna slightly to the right or left and observe if the signal strength increases. For each tweak, allow a few seconds in each position to determine if the signal strength increases.



If the signal reception is good, but there is no audio, verify your audio connection.

- If you are connected to a home stereo system, be sure the system is set to the auxiliary input source, and you have connected the Stereo Audio Cable to the auxiliary input connectors.
- If you are connected to powered speakers, be sure the speakers are plugged into an outlet, and are turned On.

The audio level of your radio can also be increased. Refer to the User Guide which accompanied your radio and increase the audio level.

If you still have questions, for example, 'Are there any other options/things I should consider?', etc., refer to "Troubleshooting" on page 49.

### Subscribe

Before you can enjoy Commercial-Free Music, plus Sports, News, Talk & Entertainment, you need to activate your Stratus 7:

- **1.** Make sure your Stratus 7 is turned on, tuned to Sirius Preview channel 184, and receiving the Sirius signal so that you can hear the Sirius audio.
- 2. When you first turn on Stratus 7, after the startup sequence, the Sirius channel lineup may update. Wait until any channel updates have completed before pressing any buttons. Once the channels have been updated, the Radio will automatically

tune to channel 184.

- **3.** Make a note of the Sirius ID. You can find it:
  - · by selecting Sirius ID in menu items
  - on channel O (zero)
  - on a label on the bottom of the gift box
  - on the label on the back of your Stratus 7
- 4. To subscribe:
  - Online: Go to siriusxm.ca/activate to access or set up an online account, subscribe to the service, and activate your Radio.

Activation usually takes less than 5 minutes, but sometimes may take longer. We recommend that your Radio remain on



until activated. When your service is activated, your Stratus 7 will display an alert message. To continue, press any button. Once subscribed, Stratus 7 will receive and you can tune to channels in your subscription plan.

Press  $\triangle$  or  $\nabla$  to tune to other channels, and  $\P$  or  $\triangleright$  to browse the different categories of channels. Learn what all the buttons do by turning to "Navigation Basics" on page 25.

### The Main Display

Whenever you power your Stratus 7 On, it will automatically tune to the last channel you were listening to before it was powered Off. Stratus 7's display screen will show the channel number, the song or show being played, and the artist name of the current channel. This screen is referred to as the main display screen in this guide.




You can also choose to have either the channel name or category name displayed on the main display screen. To pick the mode, press and hold the **menu** button, press the ▼ button to highlight **Display** and press the **Select button**. Press the ▼ button to highlight **Mode** and press the **Select button**. Then choose the desired option. (Refer to "Display" on page 44.)



### My Channels

Channels are organized into categories to make it easier for you to find the ones that suit your taste. My Channels is a special category that displays the channels contained in your subscription plan. You can display this and any category by pressing  $\P$  or  $\blacktriangleright$  until the category is displayed.



### **Navigation Basics**

#### **Power Button**



Pressing the **Power button** turns Stratus 7 On or Off.

### **Navigation Buttons**



Use the **Left**, **Right**, **Up**, and **Down** buttons to navigate through various features and functions of Stratus 7.

- Left 

   or Right 
   button: Displays the channel categories such as Rock,
   Pop, Sports, Talk/New etc. Repeated presses cycle through the
   categories one at a time. Decreases or increases the settings of various
   menu options such as Brightness, Audio Level, etc.
- Up or Down button (press and release): Immediately tunes to the next or previous channel in the channel lineup. Scrolls through lists and highlights an item in the list.
- Up 

   or Down 

   button (press and hold): Continuously scrolls
   through any list. While on the main display screen, continuously scrolls
   through the channel lineup and briefly displays the information of each
   channel. When the button is released, the Radio tunes to the last
   channel it had scrolled to in the channel lineup.

#### Select Button



The **Select button** selects a highlighted item and confirms settings. At the main display screen, pressing the **Select button** prompts for the entry of a channel number using the number buttons. Once the channel number is entered, the Radio directly tunes to the new channel. At the main display

screen, pressing and holding the **Select button** tunes to the previous channel that was being played.

#### FM/Menu Button



**FM** provides easy tuning of FM presets for optimized *Power*Connect performance. Repeatedly pressing **FM** displays and cycles through the list of preset FM channels one at a time. The Radio automatically tunes to the displayed FM channel.

Pressing and holding **menu** displays various options to make setup and feature changes. Pressing **menu** when in menu options returns to the previous menu option screen until menu options is exited. Pressing and holding **menu** when in menu options returns to the main display screen.

### **Jump Button**

When configured properly, pressing **jump** tunes to the channel broadcasting traffic and weather conditions of a selected city, from a list of the 20 most congested cities.

#### **Number Buttons**



Each number button stores a favorite channel in its button location and provides one touch access to it afterward. Number buttons also directly tune to a channel when the channel number is entered after pressing the **Select button**.

### **Listening to Satellite Radio**

#### Tune a channel:

- Press and release ▲ and ▼ to immediately tune to the next or previous channel.
- Press and hold ▲ and ▼ to speed scroll through the channels. Release to tune to channel which is displayed.

#### View a category:

Channels are organized into categories to make it easier for you to find the ones that suit your taste.

- **1.** To view a category press **4** or **▶**.
- 2. Scroll through the channels in the category using ▲ and ▼, and find the channel you want.
- **3.** Press the **Select button** to select the channel, or press **4** or **▶** for the previous or next category.

#### **Direct Tune**

A channel can be tuned directly by entering the channel number using the number buttons.


**1.** To directly tune a channel press the **Select button**.



**2.** Enter the channel number using the buttons **0-9**. Wait a moment until the channel is tuned, or press the **Select button** to immediately tune to the channel.


#### **Jump**

When configured properly, pressing **jump** will tune to the traffic and weather channel of a selected city, from a list of the 20 most congested cities. This button allows you to quickly tune the traffic/weather broadcast of the selected city, and then tune back to the original channel to which you were listening by pressing **jump** again.



If the traffic/weather broadcast of your selected city is not immediately available, the display will indicate that a jump is pending. Once the traffic/

weather report is ready to be broadcast, the Radio will automatically tune to the traffic/weather channel. Since a channel may carry the traffic and weather reports of more than one city, you may have to wait a few minutes for your desired broadcast.



Pressing the **jump** while a jump is pending will cancel the jump. Pressing **jump** after the Radio has tuned to the traffic/weather channel will return it back to the channel you to which you had been listening immediately prior to pressing **jump**.



**TIP!** To select a city for traffic/weather, refer to "Jump Settings" on page 43.

#### Returning to main display screen

When changing the Radio options using the menu options, pressing and holding **menu** in most instances will return you to the main display screen. In some instances, you may need to follow the instructions on the display screen.

#### **Favorite Channels**

You can set up to 10 of your favorite channels so you can easily access them. Each favorite channel can be assigned to a number button (0-9).

#### To assign a favorite channel to a number button:

- 1. Tune to the desired channel.
- 2. Press and hold a number button (0-9) for one second, to assign the channel as a favorite.

#### To listen to a favorite channel:

 Press the number button 0-9 that was assigned to the desired favorite channel.


### **FM Presets**

FM presets make it easy to quickly access stored FM channels and choose a new FM channel from them.

Use FM presets when you use *Power*Connect to listen to your Stratus 7 through your vehicle's FM radio.

#### To start using a different FM preset:

- **1.** Press **FM** to display the current FM channel preset.
- **2.** The currently selected FM preset is shown. To display and select the next FM preset press **FM**.
- **3.** Repeatedly pressing **FM** will cycle through the FM presets. The last displayed FM preset will be tuned. To return to the main display screen, allow the screen to time out.





**IMPORTANT!** You need to ensure that the FM Transmitter in Stratus 7 is turned On, and that your vehicle's FM radio is tuned to the same FM channel.



**TIP!** To configure the list of preset FM channels, you need to find available FM channels in your area. Refer to "Find Available FM Channels in Your Area" on page 37. Next, refer to "Set and Select an FM Channel" on page 41.


#### **Parental Lock**


Your Stratus 7 has the ability to lock channels you do not want others (such as children) to access without your permission. Locked channels will not appear in the channel or category list. The default lock code is 0000.

Locked channels can be tuned directly using the 0-9 number buttons and entering the locked channel number. You will be prompted to enter your lock code. If the lock code is correctly entered, the channel will begin playing. If you tune away from the locked channel to a different channel, the locked channel will again be locked.

#### Changing the lock code:


- 1. Press and hold **menu** until the menu options are displayed.
- 2. Press ▼ to scroll to and highlight Parental Lock and press the Select button
- Press ▼ to scroll to and highlight Change My Code and press the Select button.
- **4.** You will be prompted to enter the existing lock code. The default lock code is 0000. If this is the first time you are changing the lock code, enter **0000**, otherwise enter your lock code. Use the **0-9** number buttons to enter the code and press the **Select button**.
- **5.** Enter a new 4 digit code using the **0-9** number buttons.

- 6. Once you have entered the code you will then be prompted to enter the new code again to confirm. If you entered the same lock code again, the code is saved.
- 7. Press and hold menu to exit.

#### To lock or unlock a channel:

- **1.** Press and hold **menu** until the menu options are displayed.
- Press ▼ to scroll to and highlight Parental Lock and press the Select button.
- **3.** Lock/Unlock is highlighted. Press the Select button.
- **4.** You will be prompted to enter your 4 digit lock code. Enter the lock code using the **0-9** number buttons.
- 5. When you have entered the correct code, a list of channels will be displayed. Press ▼ and ▲ to scroll though the list and highlight a channel you want to lock or unlock.
- 6. Press the Select button to lock or unlock a channel. Note that locked channels will display a lock icon a to

the right of the channel name.

**7.** You can continue to select channels for locking or unlocking. When you are finished, press and hold **menu** to exit.


# **Configuring Your Stratus 7**

### Sirius ID

Your Stratus 7 has a numeric 12-digit ID which uniquely identifies the Radio. This ID is used during the activation process.

#### To display the Sirius ID:

- 1. Press and hold **menu** until the menu options are displayed.
- Sirius ID will be highlighted. Press the Select button. The Radio ID will be displayed.
- 3. Press and hold menu to exit.



### Find Available FM Channels in Your Area

Before attempting any of the procedures below, you should park your vehicle in a safe location. Do not attempt to set up your FM channels or any Stratus 7 function while driving.

PowerConnect allows you to listen to Sirius audio through your vehicle's FM radio. You will first need to find an available FM channel, which is a channel that is not being used by an FM radio station in your area. When you tune your FM radio to an available channel, you should only hear static or silence – not talk or music.

Once you have found an available channel, you need to tune Stratus 7's built-in transmitter to the same channel to receive Sirius sound through your vehicle's radio.

We recommend one of the following methods to find an available FM channel:

#### 1. Use the SiriusXM FM Channel Finder

Use the SiriusXM FM Channel Finder at **siriusxm.ca/fm**. Go to the website and enter your zip code. The Channel Finder will suggest a list of available FM channels in your area. For convenience, write down or print out the list.

Tune Stratus 7 to a favorite Sirius channel (or to channel 184, if it's not yet activated). Turn on your vehicle's FM radio. Pick the first FM channel on your Channel Finder list and tune the FM radio to that channel. If you do not hear a local FM station broadcast, then tune Stratus 7 to the same FM channel. (Refer to "Set and Select an FM Channel" on page 41.) You should hear the Sirius channel through your vehicle's radio. If you are satisfied with

the sound quality, you're done! If this FM channel doesn't work well for you, work down the list until you find an FM channel that allows you to hear Sirius clearly.

OR

### 2. Manually tune through your local FM channels

Manually tune through your local FM channels on your vehicle's FM radio. Turn on your vehicle's FM radio. Start at 88.1 and use the 'Manual' tune function on your vehicle's FM radio to tune through each FM channel one-by-one (88.1 followed by 88.3 etc.) to locate channels that aren't being used by a local FM radio station. Write down each FM channel that has only static or silence on it, until you reach 107.9. Once you have created your list of available FM channels, you will need to find the one that provides the best match for Stratus 7.

Tune Stratus 7 to a favorite Sirius channel (or to channel 184, if it's not yet activated). Pick the first FM channel on your list and tune the FM radio to that channel. Then tune Stratus 7 to the same FM channel. (Refer to "Set and Select an FM Channel" on page 41.) You should hear the Sirius channel through your vehicle's radio. If you are satisfied with the sound quality, you're done! If this FM channel doesn't work well for you, work down the list until you find an FM channel that allows you to hear Sirius clearly.



**NOTE!** You may find an FM channel with static or silence that does not work with Stratus 7. It is possible that some type of inaudible interference is present that prevents reception of Stratus 7 broadcast. Your only options are to use another FM channel or a different audio connection method.



**TIP!** If you regularly drive from one location to another, such as your daily commute, you may need to use different FM channels along your route for best performance. If this is the case, we recommend saving the best FM channels as presets on your FM radio and Stratus 7. Then you simply select and match the best channel for the area you are in.



**TIP!** It will be much more difficult to find available FM channels in large cities than in most suburban or rural locations. A direct audio connection using the Aux In Cable, Cassette Adapter, or professional installation is your best solution if you drive in or near large metropolitan areas.



**NOTE!** The SiriusXM FM Channel Finder relies on data from the Federal Communications Commission. The data may not reflect the latest stations in your area. In addition, local geography and weather conditions can impact reception, so your results may be different from the list.




**NOTE!** The performance of FM radios are different, based on manufacturer and vehicle style. Some may not work well with the type of FM transmitter used by Stratus 7. This is why we recommend a direct audio connection using the Aux In Cable or Cassette Adapter if they can be used in your vehicle. Professional installation can also resolve almost any performance issue.

### Turn FM Transmitter On/Off

The built-in FM Transmitter in Stratus 7 works with the *Power*Connect Vehicle Dock, and is used when you choose to listen to Stratus 7 through your vehicle's FM radio.

#### To turn the FM Transmitter On or Off:

- 1. Press and hold **menu** until the menu options are displayed.
- Press ▼ to scroll to and highlight FM Settings and press the Select button.
- Press ▼ to scroll to and highlight FM Transmitter and press the Select button.
- 4. Press either ▼ or ▲ to scroll to and highlight either On or Off and press the Select button.



5. Press and hold menu to exit.



TIP! Stratus 7 is shipped with the FM Transmitter turned On by default.



TIP! The FM1 storage location is preset with FM channel 97.9.

### Set and Select an FM Channel

Stratus 7 allows you to easily store (i.e., preset) up to 5 different FM channels. At any time, you can select any one of these 5 FM presets to transmit audio from Stratus 7 to your vehicle's FM radio. Having a choice of 5 FM presets also makes it easy to switch to the appropriate FM channel as you travel from one area to another. Each FM preset is stored in its own storage location. You can easily add or edit the FM preset in any one of the 5 storage locations.



TIP! The FM1 storage location is preset with FM channel 97.9.

#### To set an FM preset:

- **1.** Press and hold **menu** until the menu options are displayed.
- Press T to scroll to and highlight FM Settings and press the Select button.
- **3.** FM Channels will be highlighted. Press the Select button.
- 4 Press ▼ to scroll to and highlight the storage location (FM1 to FM5) that you want to set or select, and press the Select button.
- 5 Change the FM Channel for the selected storage location by pressing

#### To quickly select an FM channel from the preset list:

- 1. Press FM to display the current FM channel preset.
- **2.** The currently selected FM preset is shown. To display and select the next FM preset press **FM**.
- **3.** Repeatedly pressing **FM** will cycle through the FM presets. The FM channel displayed will be selected. To return to the main display screen, allow the screen to time out.
- **4.** Set your vehicle's FM radio to the same FM channel.



### **Jump Settings**

**Jump** can be set to jump to the traffic and weather channel of one of the 20 most congested cities. You'll need to select the desired city from the list.

#### To configure jump:

- **1.** Press and hold **menu** until the menu options are displayed.
- Press ▼ to scroll to and highlight Jump Settings and press the Select button.
- 3. A list of cities will be displayed. Press ▼ or ▲ to scroll to and highlight your desired location and press the Select button.



4. Press and hold menu to exit.

### Display

The Display option allows you adjust the brightness and contrast of Stratus 7's display to improve its visibility in different lighting conditions. You also can set the mode of the display screen to show channel name or category name information.


#### To change the display's brightness or contrast:

- **1.** Press and hold **menu** until the menu options are displayed.
- 2. Press ▼ to scroll to and highlight **Display** and press the **Select button**.



### **Audio Level**

The audio level of Stratus 7 can be adjusted when an audio connection is made between the dock and the vehicle's stereo system. Audio level is used to adjust Stratus 7's volume level to match the volume of other audio sources you may use, such as a CD player, other FM stations, or an MP3 player.

Do not use the audio level as a volume control. Use the volume control on your vehicle stereo instead.

#### To adjust the audio level:

- 1. Press and hold **menu** until the menu options are displayed.
- Press ▼ to scroll to and highlight Audio Level and press the Select button.
- **3.** Press ◀ to decrease or ▶ to increase the audio level.
- **4.** Press the **Select button** to confirm the new audio level setting.
- 5. Press and hold menu to exit.



### Signal

For best reception, your Magnetic Mount Antenna should have an unobstructed view of the Sirius satellites. In large cities, terrestrial transmitters (ground repeaters) help increase the signal coverage.

Your Stratus 7 can display the received strength of the satellite and terrestrial signals being received.

### To display the signal strength:

Press and hold **menu** until the menu options are displayed.

- **1.** Press and hold **menu** until the menu options are displayed.
- 2. Press ▼ to scroll to and highlight Signal and press the Select button.
- The Satellite and Terrestrial bars show the strength of the signal being received.



- 4. Reposition the antenna if you are having trouble getting a signal. Be sure your vehicle is outside with an unobstructed view of the sky.
- 5. Press and hold menu to exit.

### **Factory Default**




### To restore Stratus 7 to the factory defaults:

- 1. Press and hold **menu** until the menu options are displayed.
- Press ▼ to scroll to and highlight Factory Default and press the Select button.
- **3.** Press ▲ to scroll to and highlight **Yes** and press the **Select button**.
- 4. A warning screen will be displayed. If you are certain that you want to reset your Stratus 7 to the factory defaults, press to scroll to and highlight Yes and press the Select button.
- **5.** The Radio will display **Restoring**, and will be restored to the factory settings.
- 6. Press and hold menu to exit.

### **Troubleshooting**

Stratus 7 has been designed and built to be trouble-free but if you experience a problem, try this:

- Check that all connections are firm and secure.
- Make sure the vehicle power socket is clean and free of corrosion.
- Make sure you have connected Stratus 7 as described in this User Guide. Verify that the PowerConnect Power Adapter is plugged into the vehicle's cigarette lighter or power adapter socket, and that the LED on the PowerConnect Power Adapter is lit (on). If not, your vehicle may need to be running to provide power to the socket.

If you see this on the screen:	Try this:
Check Antenna Connection	The satellite antenna is not connected to the Home Dock. Check the satellite antenna connection to the Home Dock.
Acquiring Signal	No satellite signal is being received.
	Check for obstacles over or around the satellite antenna.  Change the location of the antenna to eliminate nearby obstacles (buildings, trees, overhangs, etc).
Invalid Channel	You have attempted to tune to a channel that you have not subscribed to, or does not exist. Select a channel to which you have subscribed.
Firmware Updating	Your Stratus 7 is being updated over the air with the latest software. Wait until the update is done.

# **Troubleshooting**

If this happens:	Try this:
Radio does not power on	AC Power Adapter is not connected, or the AC outlet into which it is plugged is not working.     Check that the AC Power Adapter is connected to the home dock. Try plugging the AC Power adapter into a different outlet.

No sound	The audio cables are not correctly connected. Check the audio cables at the home entertainment system and the radio.  The amplified speakers are not plugged in, or not turned on. Verify that they are plugged in and turned on.  Refer to the section, "Connect the Home Dock to a Home Stereo System or Powered Speakers" on page 12.


